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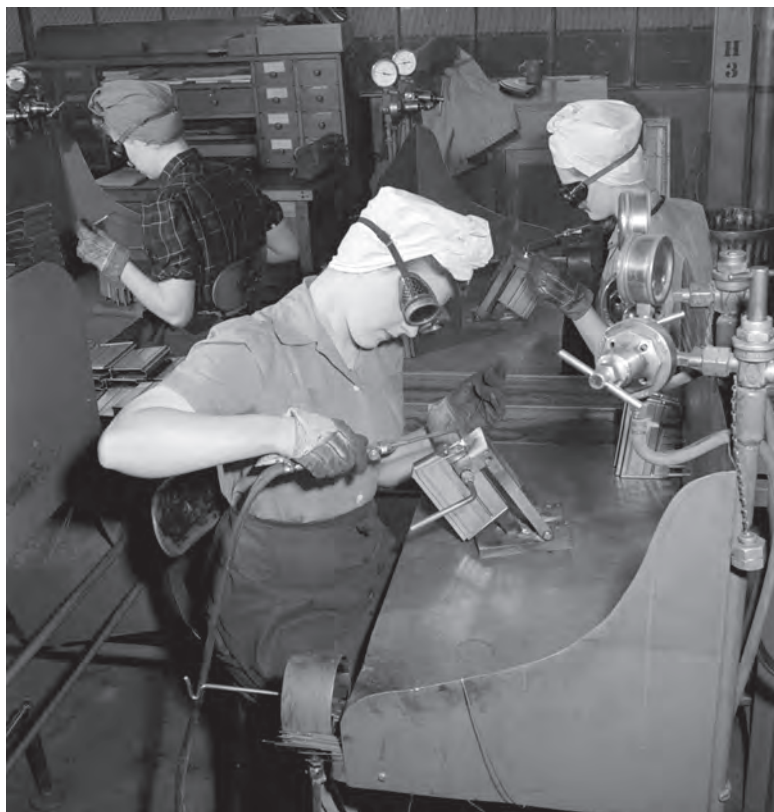
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Inside title page: Women workers weld magazine clips for special Bren guns to be shipped to China in the John Inglis Co. munitions plant.

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
