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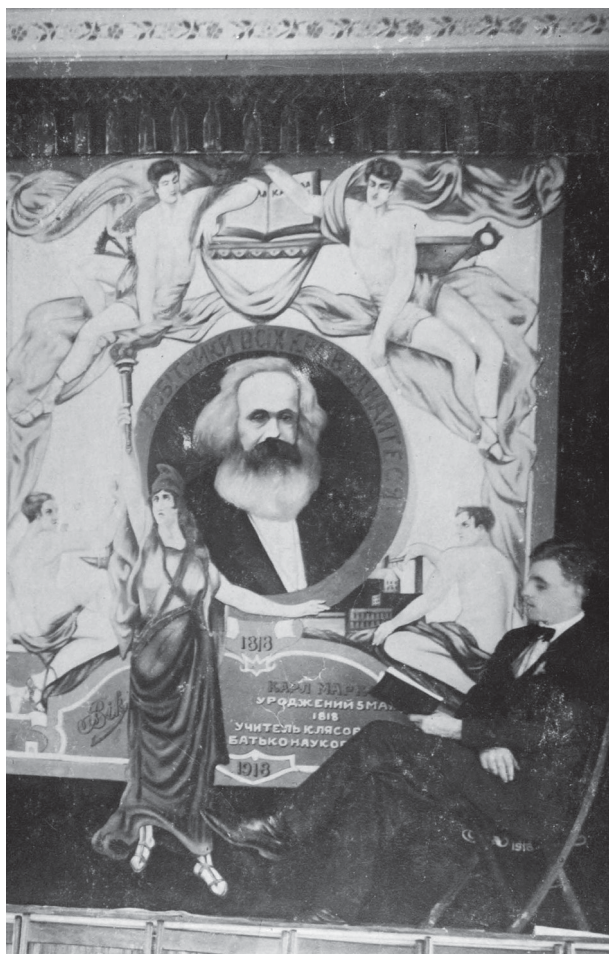
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Inside title page: A member of the USDP on stage before the celebration of the 100th anniversary of Karl Marx's birth in Winnipeg, 1918.
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
