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Cross sections in situ, meaning that the subterranean structures are shown in their original locations. In this case, the Google Earth primary database is removed from view and a “cut away” surface tile is inserted in its place as a <GroundOverlay> with terrain exaggeration set to one. The “cut away” can be achieved automatically using the line (yellow) which indicates the location of these cross sections along the surface.
