HAMILTON WATERWORKS ART COLLECTION

Dr William James of McMaster University who, with his wife recently published A Sufficient Quantity of Pure and Wholesome Water, a history of the old Hamilton pumphouse, has produced a catalogue of drawings of the waterworks. This collection, some 200 pen-and-ink and watercolour pictures, is now housed at the McMaster University Library. The pictures date from 1854 to 1940.
